- **STORM** holds a Master of Science in Forestry, University of New Brunswick (ongoing), Bachelor of Science in Forestry, University of New Brunswick, and diplomas in GIS Cartographic Specialist and Forestry Technician from Fleming College.
- She worked on projects in the National Tree Seed Centre (volunteer) - working with germination testing and cryopreservation practices and with Haliburton Forest and Wildlife Reserve highlighting their Maple-Beech single tree selection efforts. Her thesis is using frost hardiness testing and tree-ring data to explore a potential growth-frost hardiness tradeoff in red spruce from different climates.
- At NRHI, her responsibilities consist of leading specific projects so that results are delivered in a timely fashion to our forest sector partners. The R&D forester is responsible to make project networks and partnerships function at a high-performance level. They are results-driven and sensitive to the needs of our partners. Storm leads work around best practices to make our sugar maple thrive under a changing climate.
